The governmental measures put in place in the COVID-era are responsible for a public health disaster in the USA

A scientific article written by Pr Denis Rancourt, Dr Marine Baudin and Dr Jérémie Mercier published (among other places) at *denisrancourt.ca* (https://denisrancourt.ca/entries.php?id=107) shows that, based on analysis of all-cause mortality in the USA since 1900 (CDC data):

- No pandemic has occurred in the USA since 1918.
- Unprecedented mortality peaks surging at a time and/or in proportion never before seen in the history of American epidemiology appeared in the COVID-era (from March 2020 to present).
 - A large narrow peak of deaths (especially among the elderly) occurred late in the season (centered in mid-April 2020), solely in certain states (34 states do not significantly exhibit this peak), and with a highly variable intensity in the states where it occurs. This peak is contrary to epidemic behaviour, and according to the most probable hypothesis was generated by the political and medical measures applied following the declaration of a pandemic by the WHO on March 11, 2020.
 - Mortality peaks occurred (mainly in a younger population) in the summer 2020 and in the summer 2021, especially in hot-weather states and in relatively more obese and poorer populations. Those peaks are irreconcilable with past presumed viral respiratory diseases behaviour, and are most likely a consequence of the persistent chronic psychological stress induced by the government-imposed societal and economic transformations in the COVID-era.
- The USA has recreated the conditions that produced the horrendous bacterial pneumonia epidemic of 1918.

In view of the results of their study, the authors call for reviewing the new "health" policies, with transparency and accountability, to assess their consequences.
